The second week was over God's character and hearing His voice. The biggest take away from that week was that "If we do not obey God whenever he speaks, then there's no point in him speaking". So basically, we must obey. Whenever He tells us something we need to obey in faith. There were other things that God spoke to me that week but that was the biggest. Last week was about the cross and grace. Actually the Word for grace is megumi which in Kanji look like this (恵). If you look closely it has a box shape and a cross.
